LESSON 54 EXODUS 34:10-28

In the latter half of Exodus 33, Moses had begun to further intercede for the people. Although Jehovah had relented from destroying the people and commanded them to go n o

forward, the alienation was plain. Moses sought assurances from Jehovah based upon His established relationship with Moses, that Jehovah's relationship with His people would be restored. This would be demonstrated by God's presence among His people as they went. Even as Jehovah assures him, Moses presses even more for Jehovah to reveal His glory, i.e., His person and character, perhaps as the basis upon which the assurances will be carried out.	
Ch	apter 34 is the continuation and answer to Moses' request.
1. •	Chapter 34:10 is perhaps the answer for which Moses has been seeking. What is at the heart of God's response to Moses' request?
•	What are the parts of the promise that accompanies the initial response?
2.	In vv11-16, the LORD expands upon the promise. He includes several commands coupled with warning(s) to Moses for the people. Much of this is somewhat of a repetition of Exodus 23:24-35 before the confirming of the covenant in chapter 24. What are the commands in the passage?
•	What are the warnings? What was added to the warning in the passage mentioned above?

• What may be some applications for us from the current passage?

3.	Vv17-26 repeat a number of commands that have been given before, both previous to and following the making of the covenant (chapters 19-24). The commands include versions of at least two commandments (from the ten) and references to foundational events in the nation. What are the two commandments?

•	What may be the significance of Moses listing these particular commands in the context?
4.	What are some ways that vv27-28 relate to the first establishing of the covenant? What are any significant observations concerning these?
